What is Sheltered Instruction (SI)?

Sheltered Instruction is the means for making content comprehensible for English language learners, at the same time building their English language skills. With the implementation of a variety of strategies, teachers are able to make content, concepts, and information understandable to English learners. SI is built on thirty features designed to enhance and expand teachers' instructional practices. These thirty features are grouped into eight components:

- Lesson Preparation
- Building Background
- Comprehensible Input
- Strategies
- Interaction
- Practice/Application
- Lesson Delivery
- Review/Assessment

These components highlight the instructional practices that are critical for English language learners as well as benefiting all students.

Objective:

Increase the capacity for supporting English Language Learners using sheltered instructional strategies.

Focus:

Creating a framework for well-prepared and well-delivered lessons incorporating the four components of reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills.
