

8% of students in the lowest income quartile complete a college degree within 6 years

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
The Facts (Texas)



Higher Education Completion Rates (within 6 years)



Academic Advisors

- Goal cut the ratio of students to adults (advising) in half
- Achieve a 30-40 Seniors to 1 Higher Education Advisor

Academic Advisors - The Model

- Cadre of individuals to attack the To and Through
- One on One Advising/Seminar Classes/Parent Information Sessions
- Combination of the doctor/nurse practitioner model and Teach for America
- Paired directly with a high school grade level counselor
- Balance of work between academic advising and T 2-4 as determined by campus/counseling team.

Academic Advisors - The Model

- □ Free up Certified Counselors to doing counseling
- Academic Advisors work 230 days
- □ At-will employees
