



Tiered Interventions Using Evidence-Based Research, or TIER, is a project funded by the Texas Education Agency. The goal is to provide educators, caregivers, and other educational stakeholders with the knowledge and materials to ensure appropriate implementation of a multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS) in every school across Texas.

The TIER Network has developed a series of modules that focus on different components of MTSS. Within each module, you'll find more specific pathways. A pathway includes a presentation with handouts as well as a video of the presentation. The nine pathways are Communities, Leadership, Academics, Culturally Responsive, Decision Making, Screening, Progress Monitoring, Mental Health, and Behavior. Districts may combine the modules to address their specific needs.

Educators and caregivers may use the videos and handouts to walk through the content on their own.

TIER has created a webinar series: Intervention within Remote Learning Environments. This five-part series is aimed at supporting schools in delivering interventions in remote learning environments. The Texas Behavior Support Initiative (TBSI) is a state-level training mandated by Senate Bill 1196 and Texas Administrative Code 89.1053. TBSI provides foundational knowledge for the use of positive behavior interventions and supports for all students, including students with disabilities. TBSI meets legislative requirements related to procedures for the use of restraint and time-out and provides a framework for sharing a wide range of foundational-level behavior strategies and prevention-based school-wide, classroom, and individual interventions.
